Professor Sue Ellis, University of Strathclyde

Working Across the Literacy Landscapes of Children's Lives

It presents research from Scotland that explores how aspects of literacy research, pedagogy and children's lives can be entwined in ways that drive curricular choices to create a dynamic, enabling and positive learning ecology for all.

Reading Recovery in Context: The Influence of School-level Factors on Implementation and Impact

In her presentation, Dr Goldsworthy will discuss the influence of factors such as communication, understanding, commitment, and principal involvement on school-level of implementation of Reading Recovery, and how the varying conditions of implementation impact the level of success (i.e., fidelity, support, sustainability) the program can achieve in context.
